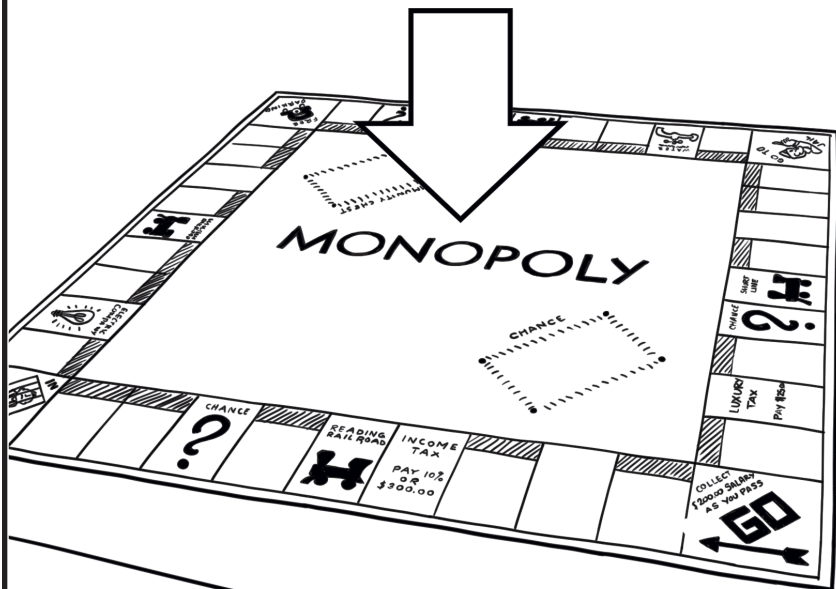
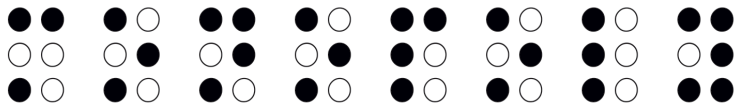
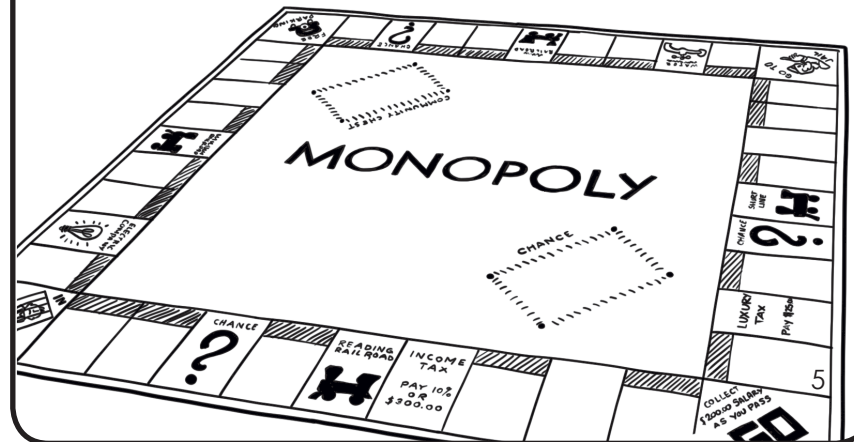


In 1970, a Braille Monopoly game was made. It was for people who are blind.



The game sells all over the world. It comes in many languages. The longest game lasted 70 days!

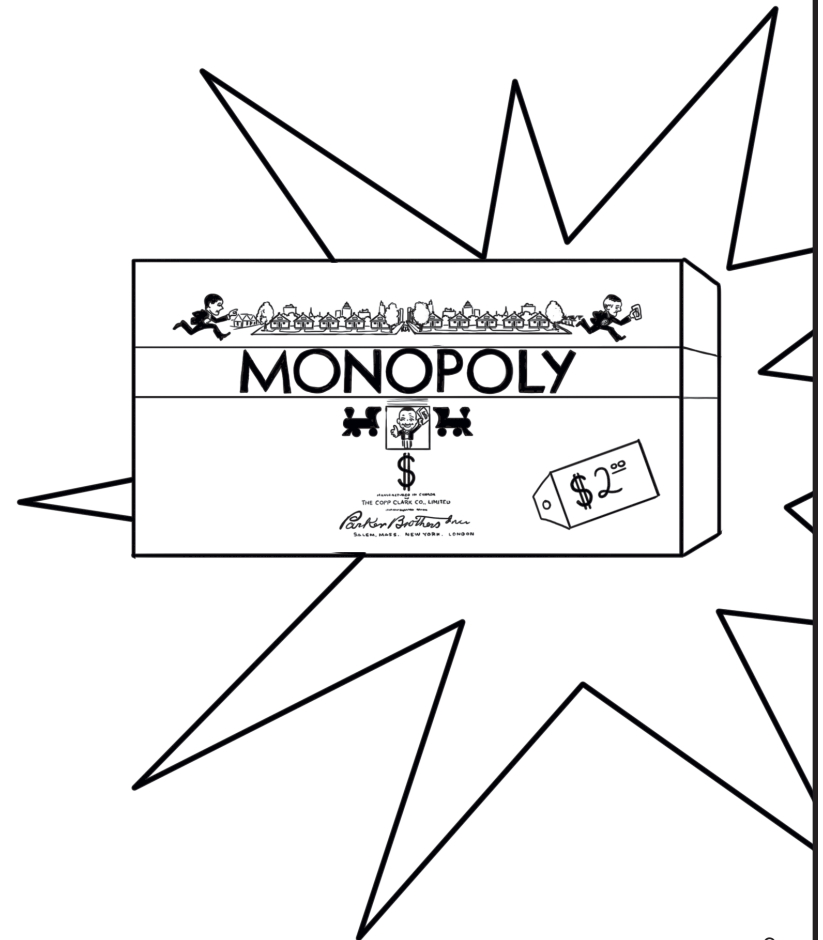

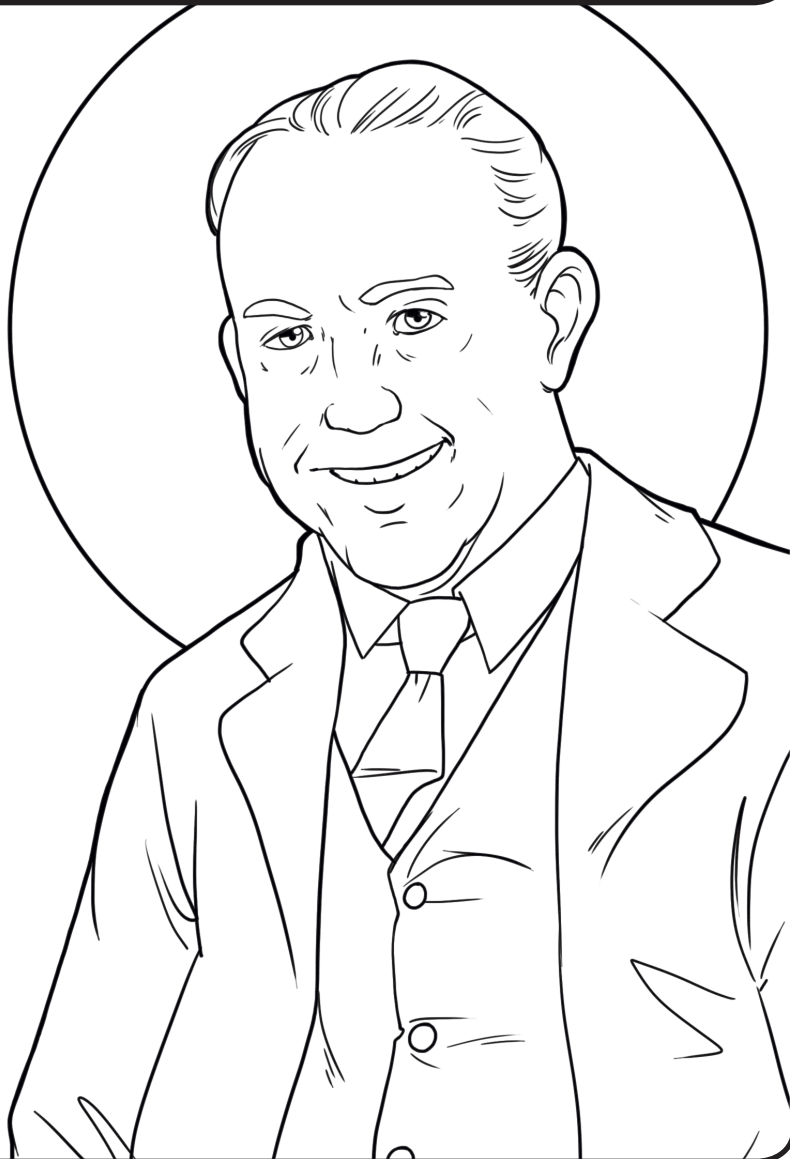

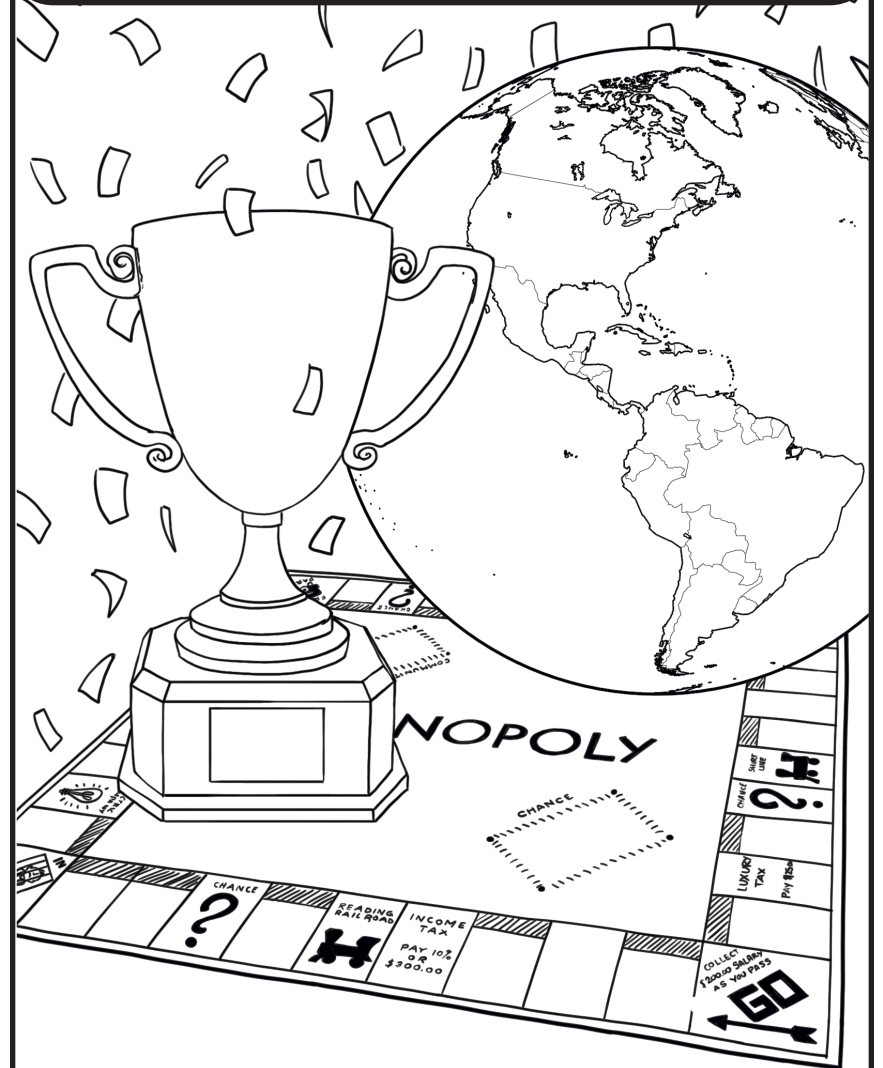

Glossary

life-size – This means that it is the same size as a person.

Braille – It is a reading system for people who are blind. It enables them to read. The letters of the alphabet are raised dots that you can feel.

token – It is a piece of metal that can be used as money or as a game piece.

tournament – It is a sports competition that can last for several days. People play each other to see who is the champion. It is a contest of skill.
